Polish sausage

You hardly can go wrong when it comes to buying Polish sausage in Chicago. Several butchers have wide followings for their links, the largest of which perhaps is the venerable Slotkowski Sausage Co., at 2021 W. 18th St., which sells wholesale and retail, telephone: 226-1667. Among the establishments using Slotkowski Polish are the Busy Bee Restaurant, 1550 N. Damen Ave., and Jim's Original Hot Dogs, a greasy stand on the northwest corner of Maxwell and Halsted Streets, where probably more Polish sausages are consumed Sunday mornings than all week at any other place in the city.

Some sausage devotees also swear by the homemade Polish from Gene's Sausage Shop and Delicatessen, 5330 W. Belmont Ave., available both fresh and smoked for about \$2.29 per pound. Hours at Gene's are from 9 a.m. to 8 p.m. during the week, 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. Saturday and 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. on
